

An Outline on Lunar-Based Multiple Personality Syndrome

The Basics

- Lunar-Based Multiple Personality Syndrome is a subset of the general condition of Multiple Personality Disorder in which the subject's other personalities are influenced by the waxing and waning phases of the moon.
- Unlike general Multiple Personality Disorder, only one personality can take over during a certain moon phase. (i.e. about 3 to 5 days based on the moon's synodic (phase) period. (29.5 days.)) Other symptoms of Multiple Personality Disorder are unaffected. (i.e. blackouts, memory loss.)

The Lunar-Based Personalities

- There are five personality types based on the waxing and waning phases of the moon. (Crescent, Quarter, Half, Gibbous and Full Moon.)
- The reasons why there are no personality types for the Dark and New Moon are still unknown at this time.

The Five Phase-based Temperments

- Crescent: Humorous Trickster personality that enjoys playing pranks.
- Quarter: Very philosophical and brooding.
- Half Moon: Even-tempered and acts as an unofficial meditator of the psyche.
- Gibbous: Gentle Artistic Personality. Spends most of their time creating works of art.
- Full Moon: Energetic, active and very brash.

Waxing and Waning Phases

- The Waxing and Waning Phases have more of an intensity affect on the Five Moon-Based Personalities.
- The Waxing Phase increases the emotion potency of the dominant temperament while the Waning Phase decreases it.

Treatment for Lunar-Based Multiple Personality Syndrome

- The probability for successful treatment is roughly the same as general Multiple Personality Syndrome. However, Psychiatrists will have to adjust to interacting with only one personality per Moon Phase.
